CITY COUNCIL MEETING

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Alexander.

A motion was made by Keith Gilley to dispense of the reading of the minutes and approve them. The motion was second by Joyce Jeffreys, with all voting in favor.

Mayor Alexander advised the Council he was working on loan options for purchasing a new street sweeper and knuckle boom truck. The cost would be approximately \$431,000.00. As soon as he had the information, he would bring it back to the Council.

Mayor Alexander advised the Council about the possibility of contracting with the County to provide dumpsters in the City Limits with the City receiving 12.5 percent in revenue.

Ordinance 2016-001 Establishing Use of Electronic Vote Counting Devices was introduced by Keith Gilley. A motion was made by Joyce Jeffreys to suspend the rules and move for immediate consideration. A motion was made by Denise Lovett to adopt Resolution 2016-006 appointing Lola Posey as Election Manager and Absentee Election Manager. Upon discussion, Cassandra Lee questioned the appointment of Lola Posey rather than Frances Blankenship. The motion was second by Keith Gilley. Ayes were: Denise Lovett, Keith Gilley, Brent White and Joyce Jeffreys. Nays: Cassandra Lee.

A motion was made by Brent White to adopt Resolution 2016-007 approving compensation of the Absentee Election Manager. The motion was second by Joyce Jeffreys, with all voting in favor.

A motion was made by Denise Lovett to adopt Resolution 2016-008 concerning the Municipal Water Pollution Prevention Program (MWPP). The motion was second by Keith Gilley, with all voting in favor.
