The following items were discussed:

1. Blue Cross-Blue Shield Health Insurance - City Clerk Shirley Gilley presented the Council with information on the increase of the City's Health Insurance. She advised the Council a representative from Lakeshore Benefits would be at the next council meeting to provide information for an alternative insurance program.
2. Deer Run Golf Course Free Play – Mayor Alexander discussed with the Council about employees being allowed to have free play at Deer Run Golf Course and to clarify who this applies to. According to City Council Minutes, dated March 2, 1992, the Council voted to allow employees, volunteer firemen and auxiliary to play free, however this was then rescinded at the next meeting held on March 16, 1992. The Council discussed only allowing current employees to play free. The employees would be responsible for golf cart rental.
3. Surplus Property Auction – Mayor Alexander advised the Council any surplus equipment or property the City had would be taken to Tac Enterprises for an auction on May 14th.
4. BZA & Planning Commission – Mayor Alexander advised the Council there was one vacancy on the BZA Board and two vacancies on the Planning Commission and asked for recommendations on appointments to these boards.
5. Donated Property – Mayor Alexander advised the Council John W. Harris had donated three acres of property located on Parker Road to the City of Moulton.
6. Solid Waste Truck Purchase – Mayor Alexander advised the Council the Solid Waste Truck would be five years old in a few months and requested approval to advertise for the purchase of a new one.
7. Information on Street Repair – Mayor Alexander advised the Council the contractor will begin the street patching within the next two weeks.
8. Sidewalk Project Byler & College – Mayor Alexander advised the Council the last grant project for sidewalks on Byler & College Streets would not be funded this year, but he will file again next year.
9. Council Member Brent White discussed with the Council about doing a proclamation for NeSmith's in recognition of their 50 years in business.
