The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jolly. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Jolly followed with prayer.

The first item on the agenda was the scheduled "Public Hearing on Vacating a portion of College St" that is located between the elementary and middle school. Mayor Jolly opened the meeting for anyone to make known their concerns in favor or against this being done. There was no one present to speak in the audience of the meeting in opposition or in favor of the vacating of a portion of College St. Councilman Danny Morris only concern was due to the lunchroom being a safe shelter would it still be accessible to the public for the purpose of using the shelter. Mayor Jolly stated that yes, the shelter would still be open for use when necessary and the street would be accessible for this purpose to the public. Councilman Gilley ask what was all included

Due to the previous contractors not meeting expectations for the care of the Moulton Memory Gardens about the lawn services. Mayor Jolly had been out to the cemetery and was not satisfied with the work that had been done on more than one occasion. He met with Integrity Lawn Care owner and told him their services were no longer needed, and they were notified also by certified letter and per contract they would receive the pay promised for the 30 days. Mayor Jolly had contacted the League and City Attorney and per their instructions went to the next lowest bidder from the original bid packets. Fresh Cut Services was notified by Mayor Jolly and agreed to come out and handle getting the cemetery in shape ASAP then they will keep up the contract as applied and agreed on.

Resolution 2026-010 was introduced to Council to approve for Fresh Cut Services to take over the contract for Lawn Care Services at Moulton Memorial Gardens.
